Chapter 1: Introduction to Shreyarth University

1.1 Concept and Inception:

1.1.1 The Backdrop

The most renowned newspaper [and the biggest media house] of Gujarat, namely GUJARAT SAMACHAR, is a household name in Gujarat – and all over the world, wherever Gujaratis live. One major reason for this is that the promoters are in constant touch with the explicit and implicit thought processes and aspirations of the society, especially in Gujarat. This has helped them channel their social service efforts in the best possible manner, where the efforts would touch the neediest. The Shah family has been very active for over 75 years in this endeavor. Understanding the primacy of education in improvement of social conditions, the family has been running a number of charities in the education sector, apart from providing funds and other support to all who need it, wherever and whenever. A lot of their effort is channelized through SHREYARTH FOUNDATION, a Section 25 company, incorporated in 2017, with registered office in Ahmedabad.

1.1.2 Establishment of the University

Looking to the approach of the government to expand the reach and depth of higher education, by giving a great opportunity to private universities, Shreyarth Foundation decided to establish a university to bring its vision to a reality. In 2019, they sought permission from the state government to start SHREYARTH UNIVERSITY, at their large plot of land at village Jorajina Muvada, Ta. Prantij, Dist. Sabarkantha.

The government secured the necessary legislation, in the form of the Gujarat Private Universities (Amendment) Act, 2019 (Gujarat Act No. 19 of 2019), and a notification duly was published by Education Department, Schivalaya, Gandhinagar on 20th September, 2019 (Notification Number GH/SH/81/EPU/2019/949/KH), wherein it is mentioned that “in exercise of the powers conferred by the Sub Section (2) of Section 1 of the Gujarat Private Universities (Amendment) Act, 2019 (Gujarat Act No. 19 of 2019), (hereinafter referred to as “the said act”), the Government of Gujarat hereby appoints the dated 25th September, 2019 as the date on which the said Act shall come into force.”



1.1.3 Starting of the University

The initial time was spent in planning for designing the proper institutional framework for the University so that it could offer the best possible world-class education to the aspiring youth, but unfortunately the COVID-19 pandemic struck the world, and the country went into a lockdown, which proved a great setback for the university's endeavor to get off to a good start.

Finally, after a year, the effects of the pandemic on the society started waning, and parents also started to lose the fear of sending their children to large gatherings – very essential for schools and colleges! However, there was a little reluctance to sending their wards to a distant place like This prompted the university to approach the government for permission to operate the University at a premises in the centre of Ahmedabad city, namely Ashram Road, at a fully functional property owned by the family, and government was gracious enough to allow this arrangement for three years.

1.1.4 The Initial Years

The Founders had gathered a great team of academicians, administrators, university governors and advisors. After detailed deliberations on the needs of the society and its immediate, medium-term and long-term requirements, the university decided to introduce three major programme streams for immediate offering:

- Bachelor of Business Administration [3 years]
- Bachelor of Computer Applications [3 years]
- Nursing:
 - Bachelor of Science (Nursing) [4 years]
 - Government Nursing and Midwifery [Certificate course; 3 years].

The admissions to the first two courses started in July 2021, and Nursing admissions, being centralized, commenced in December 2021. University could successfully obtain the essentiality certificates for Nursing courses, which are regulated by the Indian Nursing Council as per legislation.



The founders managed to create excellent infrastructure for all the courses in a very short time, along with laboratories, library and the administrative spaces.

1.1.4 The Initial Team

Dr. Subhash Brahmhatt had assumed charge of the first Registrar of the University on 10th July, 2020. Thereafter, the University recruited the seed staff for academics and administration, and commenced the academic activity. The first Provost, Prof. Neeraj Yajnik, assumed office on 21st November, 2021.

1.2 Logo of Shreyarth University



The Logo of Shreyarth University represents light permeated through Sun rays. The Logo symbolises expansion of life's vision. Tender branches of trees depicted here mean growing aspirations. The book symbolizes knowledge. And, finally, sacred conch shell stands for knowledge-enabled truth for success.

The motto of the university is in Sanskrit, श्रेयस्करं ज्ञानम्, and means "knowledge benefitting all" has germinated from inquisitiveness and the ultimate objective of obtaining such knowledge is to attain eternal truth which is pervading in this universe.

1.3 University Prayer

Shreyarth University starts every day with the Saraswati Vandana, which is sung by all in the campus.



Gandhiji said: "Prayers is the key of the morning and bolt of the evening". Every day in the campus of Shreyarth University, all classes start with Saraswati Vandana and the whole atmosphere becomes very pious. The lyrics of the prayer is given below:

या कुन्देन्दुतुषारहारधवला या शुभ्रवस्त्रावृता
या वीणावरदण्डमण्डितकरा या श्वेतपद्मासना।
या ब्रह्माच्युत शंकरप्रभृतिभिर्देवैः सदा वन्दिता
सा मां पातु सरस्वती भगवती निःशेषजाड्यापहा॥

Meaning of the Saraswati Prayer –

Salutations to Devi Saraswati, who is pure white like Jasmine, with the coolness of Moon, brightness of Snow and shine like the garland of Pearls; and who is covered with pure white garments, whose hands are adorned with Veena (a stringed musical instrument) and the boon-giving staff; and who is seated on pure white Lotus, who is always adored by Lord Brahma, Lord Acyuta (Lord Vishnu), Lord Shankara and other Devas, O Goddess Saraswati, please protect me and remove my ignorance completely.



Chapter 2: University Information

Following are the **authorities of Shreyarth University** under **section 19** of the **Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009** - namely:

- (c) The Academic Council; and
- (d) In addition to the authorities as mentioned above of the University as described under section 19 of the said act, the following other authorities are also recommended under the statute as provided under sub section (d) of section 19:
 - 1) Board of Studies / Area Committee;
 - 2) Finance Committee;
 - 3) Planning and Developing Board;
 - 4) Committee for Equivalence of Examination;
 - 5) Examination Committee for Declaration of Result;
 - 6) The Committee for Appointment of Paper Setters and Examiners;
 - 7) The Examination Reforms Committee;
 - 8) Library Committee;
 - 9) Research Council.

Now, a brief about 3 important authorities of Shreyarth University is explained here, i.e., – 1) Governing Body 2) Board of Management 3) Academic Council and 4) Board of Studies of School of Management, School of Computer Science and Applications and Shreyarth College of Nursing.

2.1 Governing Body:

List of its Governing Body members is given at Annexure – 5 to this Report.

Dates of its meetings and its important resolutions are given below:

Two meetings of Governing body took place between 25th September, 2019 to 31st March, 2022. Details of those two meetings are given below:



First meeting of Governing Body of the Shreyarth University constituted under section 20(1) was held on 10th July, 2020 at 4.30 p.m. at GSTV Campus, S.G. Highway, Ahmedabad – 15.

The following important resolutions were passed in the **first Governing Body meeting on 10th July, 2020:**

Resolution 1: Resolved that the appointment of Shri Shreyansh Shah as the president of Shreyarth University, made by the sponsoring body for the period of three years be noted.

Resolution 2: Resolved that Shri Sudhirbhai Nanavati is appointed as a Vice-President of Shreyarth University, and he is authorized to sign all the official documents, all teaching & non-teaching staff's appointments, and contracts for and on the behalf of Shreyarth University and he will not be personally responsible & answerable in future for the same.

Resolution 3: Resolved that the provost be appointed by the President under provision of section 15 and Dr. Subhash Brahmhatt be appointed as a first registrar of Shreyarth University.

Resolution 4: Consideration of making approval to start following courses in the academic year 2020-2021 at Shreyarth University:

- 1) Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), three years degree course;
- 2) Bachelor of Digital Journalism, three years degree course;
- 3) Master of digital journalism and mass media, two years post-graduate course;
- 4) One-year digital media journalism diploma course;
- 5) One print media English/Gujarati journalism diploma course;
- 6) Six months digital media news caster, anchoring certificate course;
- 7) Six months radio R. J. (Radio Jockey) certificate course;
- 8) Three months photography course;



- 9) One year diploma and six months certificate course in the area of management and computer;
- 10) Graduation in performing arts — Dance — Music — Drama, three years degree course.

Resolved that out of the proposal of the commencements of ten courses, the following courses are approved to start with:

- 1) One-year digital media journalism diploma to be commenced from academic year 2020-21;
- 2) Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) three years degree course, to be commenced from academic year 2021-22;
- 3) In addition to above two programs, as discussed during the meeting the Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA), three years degree course, be also commenced w.e.f. academic year 2021-22.

Further resolved further that the President will also be authorized to take further action to commence the other listed programmes as and when the possibility arises.

Resolution 5: Resolved that the teaching and non-teaching staff proposed under this item be approved in principle (Appendix 5) However, the appointment be made as and when needed.

Resolution 6: Resolved that the proposal to start Shreyarth University for a period of 3 years at Gujarat Bhavan and at Sanidhya Complex, Ashram Road, Ahmedabad be approved.

Second meeting of Governing Body was held on 20th January, 2022, at 4.30 p.m.

in Conference Room of Shreyarth University, Gujarat Bhavan, Near M. J. Library, Ashram Road, Ahmedabad.

The following important resolutions were passed in **the second Governing Body meeting on 20th January, 2022:**

- 1) **Recommendation 1:** Resolved that the recommendation of the board of management with regard to the approval of the 1st and subsequent draft statutes, 1st and subsequent draft ordinances under section 26(2), 27(2), 28(2)



and 29(2) respectively of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 be accepted and that the same be approved as **per enclosure-1.1 (Appendix 6)** attached with the recommendations. Resolved further that the same be submitted to the government of Gujarat for its approval.

- 2) **Recommendation 2:** Resolved that as per the recommendations of the Board of Management with regard to the give post-facto approval of the syllabus, teaching and examination scheme and rules of governance of the programmes of Bachelor of Business Administration and Bachelor of Computer Applications be accepted and that the post facto approval be given for the academic year 2021-2022 as per **enclosure-1.2 (Appendix 7)** attached with the recommendations.
- 3) **Recommendation 3:** Resolved that the recommendations of Board of Management with regard to give post facto approval for the various appointments made in the University be accepted and that the post facto approval be given to the appointments made as per enclosure-1.3 of the recommendations.
- 4) **Recommendation 4:** Resolved that the Management be recommendations of Board of Management be accepted with regard to certificate courses and that the principle approval be given to start the various certificate courses, and Degree Programmes like Bachelor of Performing Arts, Bachelor of Communication, Journalism and Mass Communication, Integrated Master of Business Administration, Integrated M. Sc. in Computer Applications and Information Technology. Resolved further that the president be also authorized to decide the nature of various certificate courses and related details.
- 5) **Recommendation 5:** Resolved that as per the recommendations of the Board of Management with regard to the post facto approval for initiating the process of commencement for the following programmes be accepted and that the post facto approval be given to initiate the process of commencement of the programme:
 - i. General Nursing and Midwifery Nursing (GNM)
 - ii. Bachelor of Science in (B. Sc.) Nursing



2.2 Board of Management:

Second important body in the authority after Governing body is Board of Management. The list of its Members is given in Annexure – 5.

One meeting of Board of Management took place between 25th September, 2019 to 31st March, 2022. Details for the same is given below:

First meeting of Board of Management of the Shreyarth University constituted under section 20(1) was held on 20th January, 2022 at 4 p.m. at Conference Room of the University, Gujarat Bhavan, Near M. J. Library, Ashram Road, Ahmedabad.

The following important resolutions were passed in the **first meeting of Board of Management on 20th January, 2022:**

Resolution 1: Resolved to recommend to the governing body that the approval to the 1st and subsequent draft Statutes, the 1st and subsequent draft ordinances as required under section 26 (2), 27(2), 28 (2) and 29(2) respectively of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 be given as per attached Appendix 1.

Resolution 2: Resolved to recommend to the governing body that the post-facto approval to the syllabus, teaching and examination scheme and rules of governance of the programmes of Bachelor of Business Administration and Bachelor of Computer Applications for the academic year 2021-2022 be given as per Appendix 2.

Resolution 3: Resolved to recommend to the governing body that the post-facto approval to the appointments made in the University be given as per list attached as Appendix 3.

Resolution 4: Resolved to recommend to the governing body that the principle approval be given to start various certificate courses and the president of the university be authorized to decide the nature of the certificate courses and Degree Programmes like Bachelor of Performing Arts, Bachelor of Journalism and Mass Communication, Integrated Master of Business Administration, Integrated M. Sc. in Computer Applications and Information Technology and other relevant details.

Resolution 5: Resolved to recommend to the governing body that the post-facto approval for initiating the process of the commencement of following programmes for



the academic year 2021-2022 be given.

a) GNM Nursing b) B. Sc. Nursing

Resolution 6: Resolved that the draft regulations as required as per Section 30 of the Act submitted as per appendix-4 be approved.

2.3 Academic Council:

The Academic Council of the Shreyarth University was constituted under section 22(1) of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009, read with proposed draft of the first Statute 3 of the University, is constituted and the list of its members is given in Annexure – 5.

The first Meeting of the Academic Council was held on 9th February 2022 at 4 p.m. at the Conference Room, of the University, Gujarat Bhavan, Near M. J. Library, Ashram Road, Ahmedabad.

The following important resolutions were passed in the **first Academic Council meeting on 9th February, 2022:**

Resolution 1: Resolved to take on record the approval of the Establishment of Shreyarth Institute of Management, Shreyarth Institute of Computer Applications and Shreyarth College of Nursing, as accorded by the Governing Body of the University.

Resolution 2: Resolved to take on record the approval of the commencement of the following programmes for the academic year 2021-2022 as accorded by the Governing Body of the University:

- 1) Bachelor of Business Administration;
- 2) Bachelor of Computer Applications;
- 3) General Nursing Midwifery; and
- 4) Bachelor of Science (Nursing)

Resolution 3: Resolved to take on record the approval of the syllabus, teaching and Examination Scheme, Admission Policy and Academic Rules of Governance for the First Year (1st and 2nd Semesters) of the programmes of Bachelor of Business Administration and Bachelor of Computer Applications for the academic year 2021-2022 (Appendix 1) as accorded by the Governing Body of the University.



Resolution 4: Resolved to take on record the approval of the draft first and subsequent statutes and Ordinances framed as required under different sections of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 (Appendix-2), as accorded by the Governing Body of the University.

Resolution 5: Resolved to take on record the approval of the Regulations framed under Section 30 of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 (Appendix-3), as accorded by the Board of Management of the University.

Resolution 6: Resolved that the post facto approval to the Memorandum of Understanding signed with the Shalby Hospital, Devasya Hospital and Aashka Hospital for the GNM and B Sc. Nursing Programmes as per the provision of the draft Ordinance No. 15. be accorded and the same be recommended to the Board of Management for approval.

Resolution 7: Resolved that the post facto approval be given to the recognition of the Halls of Residence for GNM and B. Sc. (Nursing) students, and the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed with Sanskar Hostel (for girls) and with Sunny PG and Hostel (for boys) as per Ordinance No. 13 and the same be recommended to the Board of Management for approval.

2.4 Area Committee / Board of Studies Members of School of Management:

In view of the fact that the Statutes had not been drawn up, a provisional arrangement of Area Committees was instituted, in place of the Board of Studies for the various programmes. After the Statutes were drafted, the regular Boards of Studies were constituted, and regular arrangement has been functioning ever since.

Resolution 2: A) A detailed presentation of the teaching and evaluation scheme of the BBA programme was made to the committee. The committee appreciated the inclusion of two enrichment courses in each semester. The 60% - Continuous Internal Evaluation and 40% - End Semester Evaluation scheme was also considered to be suitable for holistic development of the students.

B) The committee resolved that the Teaching and Evaluation Scheme of BBA Programme stands approved as per Appendix – 1.

Resolution 3: A) Syllabi for each subject were discussed in detail in the meeting and the rationale behind including them in the syllabus was given. The committee recommended that varied and innovative pedagogical tools and methods such as case study, role plays, in-class exercises, group discussion, interactive session, dissertation and flipped classroom should be used to teach the courses.

B) The committee resolved that the Syllabi of Semester – I of BBA Programme stands approved as per Appendix 2.

Resolution 4: A) Detailed discussion on the academic regulations - admission, courses, assessment, examination, grading system, passing standards, promotion and



cancellation of admissions was conducted.

B) The committee resolved that the Academic Regulations of the BBA Programme stands approved as per Appendix – 3.

GUJARAT ACT NO. 19 OF 2019.

(First published, after having received the assent of the Governor, in the "*Gujarat Government Gazette*", on the 20th August, 2019).

AN ACT

further to amend the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009.

WHEREAS the Shreyarth Foundation, Ahmedabad, Charutar Arogya Mandal, Karamsad, ASIA Charitable Trust, Ahmedabad, Bhagwan Mahavir Education Foundation, Surat, Silver Oak Education And Research Society, Ahmedabad, Lok Jagruti Kendra Trust, Ahmedabad, have applied to the State Government under the provisions of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 to establish Private Universities in the State;

AND WHEREAS the said applications have been scrutinised by the Scrutiny Committee and on report of the Scrutiny Committee, the State Government has issued the Letter of Intent to the respective sponsoring body for establishment of the Private University;

AND WHEREAS the State Government is satisfied that the sponsoring bodies have complied with the conditions of Letter of Intent as provided in section 10 of the said Act and have also established the Endowment Fund as per the Letter of Intent;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Government of Gujarat, in accordance with the provisions of section 10 of the said Act, includes the institutions specified in column 2 of the Schedule as the Private University, by the name and location of the aforesaid sponsoring bodies as specified in column 4 of the said Schedule.

It is hereby enacted in the Seventieth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

Short title and commencement.

1. (1) This Act may be called the Gujarat Private Universities (Amendment) Act, 2019.

(2) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification in the *Official Gazette*, appoint.

2. In the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009, in the Schedule, after the entry at serial No. 28, the following entries shall be inserted, namely:-

Sir,

With reference to your letter no Shreyarth University/UGC/014/2019 dated 15th November, 2019 on the subject cited above, I am directed to inform you that the UGC has received the Act No. 19 of 2019 further to amend the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 of the State Legislature of Gujarat wherein Shreyarth University, C/o Gujarat Samachar Bhavan, Khanpur, Ahmedabad has been established as a Private University notified vide Notification No. GH/SH/81/EPU/2019/949/KH-1 dated 20th September, 2019. The Act shall come into force with effect from 25.09.2019. In view of the establishment of the Shreyarth University, C/o Gujarat Samachar Bhavan, Khanpur, Ahmedabad by State Act, the name of the University has been included in the list of universities established as per section 2(f) of UGC Act, 1956, as maintained by the UGC on its website www.ugc.ac.in.

The University may note and adhere the following:-

1. The inclusion of the name of the University in the list of Universities maintained by the UGC does not by itself allow the University to make admissions in its programmes. This may be done only after creation of required academic and physical infrastructure facilities, including library, laboratories and appointment of teaching and supporting staff as per the norms and standards laid down by the UGC and Statutory Council(s) concerned.

2. The University is now requested to submit detailed information in the enclosed format **(Annexure-I)(soft copy as well as hard copy)** along with supporting documents duly attested by the Registrar of the University within a period of 3 months from the receipt of this letter. This format along with appendices is also available on the UGC website www.ugc.ac.in

3. After receipt of the Information in the above mentioned format, the following procedure would be adopted by the UGC for inspection of the University:-

- (a) The information received from the University in the prescribed format would be posted on the UGC website within 10 days of the receipt of the information (Annexure-I). Comments would be invited from the general public within 1 month thereafter about the information submitted by the University. The same information (Annexure-I) shall also be posted by the University on its website immediately. The comments received from the general public would be placed before the visiting UGC Expert Committee for perusal.
- (b) An Expert Committee would be constituted by the UGC to ascertain whether the University fulfils the criteria in terms of programmes, faculty, infrastructural facilities, financial viability, etc. as laid down from time to time by the UGC and other concerned statutory bodies such as AICTE, BCI, MCI, DCI, INC, NCTE, PCI, etc.
- (c) The UGC Expert Committee would visit the University within 3 months of the receipt of the information (Annexure-I) for on the spot assessment of infrastructure and other facilities available with the University. The report prepared by the UGC Expert Committee would be sent to the University within 2 weeks of the completion of the visit for comments.
- (d) The University may respond to the report within a period of two weeks after its receipt. After receipt of comments from the University, the report and comments from the University, if any, would be placed before the Commission for consideration.
- (e) The Commission shall take final decision in the matter. It may require the University to submit a compliance report in respect of the observations/suggestions of the UGC Expert Committee. The compliance report submitted by the University shall be placed before the Commission for consideration.
- (f) On approval of the Commission, an Approval Letter would be issued by the UGC to the effect that the University fulfils the criteria in terms of programmes, faculty, infrastructural facilities, financial viability, etc. as laid down from time to time by the UGC and other concerned statutory bodies.
- (g) If it is found that the Private University has, even after getting an opportunity to do so, failed to comply with the provisions of the various UGC Regulations including UGC (Establishment of and maintenance of standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 and suggestions given by the UGC Expert Committee, the Commission may pass an order prohibiting the University from offering any course for the award of the degree and/or the post-graduate degree/diploma, as the case may be, till the deficiency is rectified.

(h) The UGC may also take necessary action against a University awarding a first degree and /or a post-graduate degree, which are not specified by the UGC and inform the public in general through a public notification.

4. As per the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Prof. YashpalVs.State of Chhattisgarh, there is no provision to have Regional Centres/off-campus centres beyond the territorial jurisdiction of the State. In view of the judgement of Hon'ble apex court, the University is requested to adhere to the following:-

a. No off-campus centre(s) is opened by the University outside the territorial jurisdiction of the State in view of the judgement of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in case of Prof. Yashpal vs. State of Chhattisgarh.

b. In case the University has already started any off campus centre outside the State, it must be closed down immediately. It may also be ensured that any off campus centre within the State shall be opened only as per the provision laid down in the UGC (Establishment of and maintenance of standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 and with the prior approval of UGC.

c. The University shall not have any affiliated Colleges.

d. The University has to follow UGC (Minimum standards and procedure for award of M.Phil/Ph.D. degree) Regulations, 2016.

5. The University is required to follow the UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulation, 2003 and other Regulations issued from time to time and posted on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in.

With reference to your Letter No.SU/UGC/1001 dated 23.07.2020 on the above subject, I am directed to inform you that **Shreyarth University, C/o Gujarat Samachar Bhavan, Khanpur, Ahmedabad** has been established by an Act of State Legislature of Gujarat as a Private University and is empowered to award degrees as specified under Section 22 of the UGC Act through its main campus in regular mode with the approval of Statutory Bodies and Statutory Council(s), wherever it is required and after creating required academic and physical infrastructure facilities including library, laboratories and appointment of teaching and supporting staffs as per the norms and standards laid down by UGC and other relevant Statutory Council(s).

Shreyarth University, C/o Gujarat Samachar Bhavan, Khanpur, Ahmedabad-380001, Gujarat is not authorized to open study centre/ off campus centre beyond the territorial jurisdiction of the state as per the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in case of Prof. Yashpal vs. State of Chhattisgarh. The University cannot open its centre(s) even within the state as per the provision of UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 without the approval of UGC

The UGC has not granted any approval to the University to open off campus/study centre.

The University cannot offer its programmes through franchising arrangement with Private coaching institutions even for the purpose of conducting of courses through distance mode.

The name of University has been included in the list of Universities maintained by UGC under Section 2 (f) of the UGC Act, 1956.
