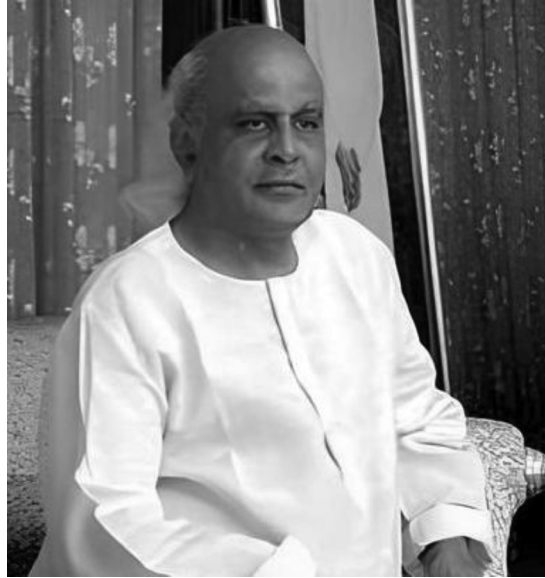

From the President's Desk...

The Fourth Annual Report 2024–25 of Shreyarth University serves as a comprehensive record of the institution's academic progress, infrastructural development, research initiatives, student achievements, and administrative roles. This document reflects our commitment to excellence in education and our continuous efforts to align with global standards. It provides valuable insights into the advancements and milestones achieved over the past year, emphasizing our dedication to fostering knowledge, innovation, and holistic development.

In the academic year 2024–25, the University introduced several new programs, namely Bachelor of Commerce – Honours, Bachelor of Science in Cyber Security, Networking and Cloud Computing, Diploma in Computer Science Engineering, Diploma in Information Technology, Master of Business Administration, Master of Computer Applications, and Post Graduate Diploma in Journalism and Digital Communication. In total, the University started seven new programmes in 2024–25. These programs aim to provide students with enhanced learning opportunities, better career prospects, and a strong academic foundation.

Since its inception in 2021–22 with an initial enrolment of **144** students, the University has shown steady growth and reached a total student strength of 1075 and 109 pass out in 2024–25. Along with this, the University has **68** teaching staff and 8 non-teaching staff across various programmes to support academic activities. To accommodate this strength, the University has **29** classrooms equipped with smart boards, LCD projectors, and internet connectivity, along with **15** laboratories for various programmes with a total of **340** computers. The reading and information objectives have been achieved with 1,586 books available in the University library for the said year. The University has also developed an in-house printing facility for the Examination Section.

The University follows a continuous evaluation pattern for student assessment, which is a key criterion under the implementation of the National Education Policy–2020. Students are also assessed through final evaluations under semester-end examinations. Under the guidance of knowledgeable faculty members, students have achieved excellence in the final examinations, with major programmes consistently recording a pass percentage of more than 75%. Approximately 93% of students have been promoted to higher semesters with ATKT (Allowed to Keep Term). The University and its constituent schools/college organized 20 curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities to promote students' overall development and enhance experiential learning.

Looking ahead, Shreyarth University aims to expand in emerging areas like cyber security and networking, and as a training initiative university MOU with IBM Skill Build, introduce industry-integrated learning programmes, and further strengthen faculty–student engagement. Plans are underway to launch research activities including phd programme, introduce new short-term certification courses, and establish collaborations with leading industries to enhance students' career prospects. Also to strengthen online programmes.

The University extends its sincere gratitude to the authorities and advisors, faculty members, students, administrative staff, and all stakeholders for their support to proceed. This report stands as a testimony to the collective efforts made toward academic excellence, and the University looks forward to another year of success and innovation.

1. 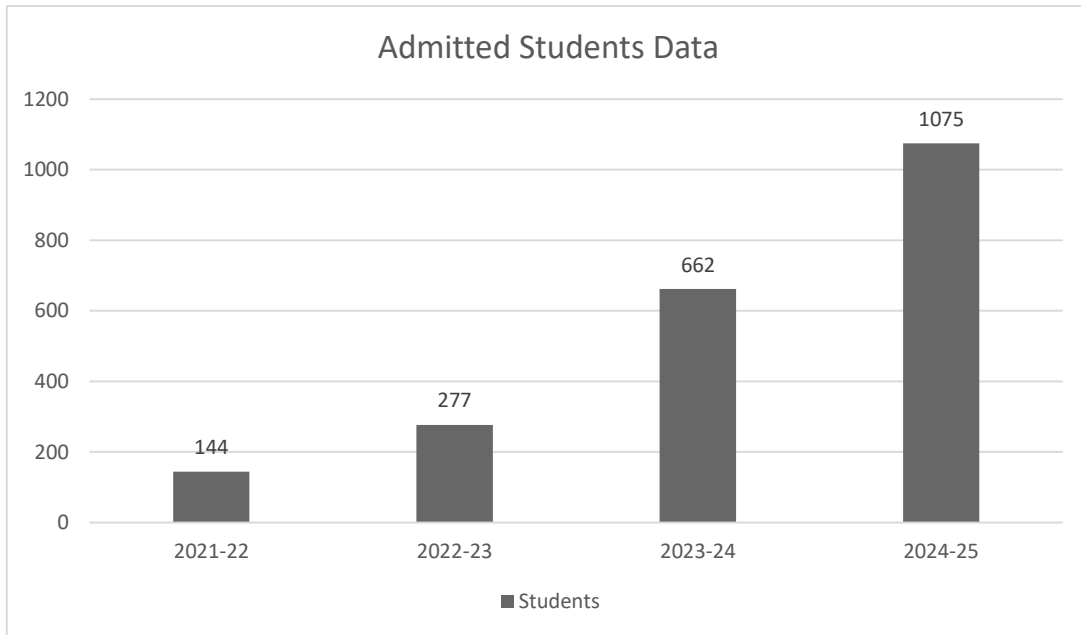

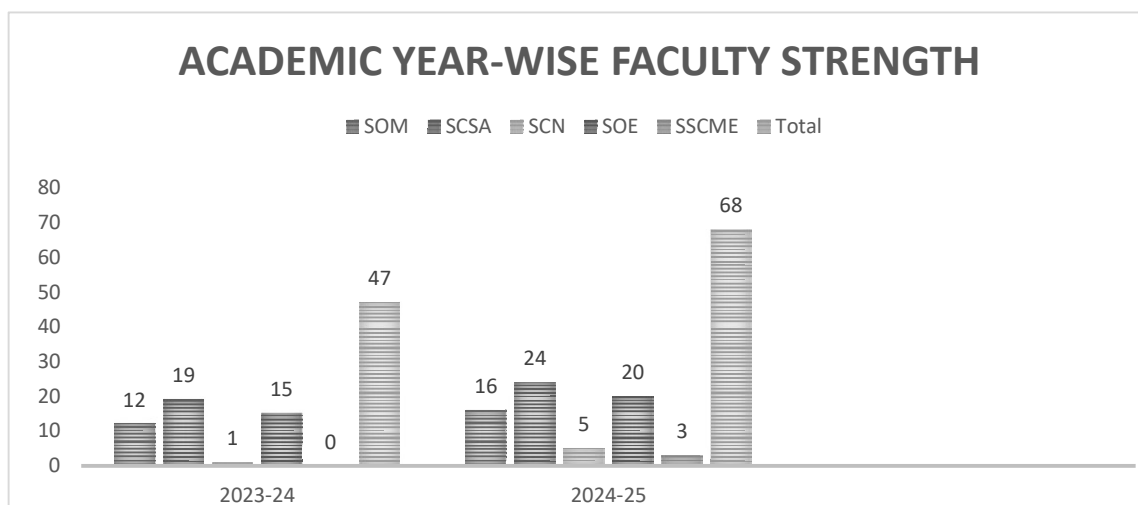


